THE FOLLOWING IS A HISTORY OF THE LEFFINGWELL FAMILY

BEGINNING WITH LIEUTENANT THOMAS LEFFINGWELL OF NORWICH, CONNECTICUT.

The earliest record of any Leffingwell coming to America was about the year of 1637, a short time after the first settlement of New England, There appeared among the forests of Connecticut, a young hunter calling himself Thomas Leffingwell. He was on friendly terms with the Mohegan Inc. Indians; especially with their young chief, Uncas. It was thought he may have occasionally lived among them, acquiring their language and sharing their adventures. He was gifted with unusual physical strength, which for a time, appeared in his descendants. Some of the Leffingwellshave the renown of having been stalwart men, able horsemen, enterprising, robust, dreadnaught kind of people. He was endowed with courage which does not shrink from the greatest of perils, when danger is the only path to great accomplishment. He became one of the founders of a large and flourishing city--Norwich, Connecticut Research eludes the question of his origin --- what year h e came to the New World and who were his parents. Some have reason to believe he may have emigrated here with an older married sister and that perhaps she died soon after, leaving him to make his own way, or that he might have come with an uncle or an older brother to Massachusetts and then may have gone from Boston to the new settlements in Connecticut with some early settlers. From the first he became a public man. As a military man he attained only the rank of Lieutonant, but as sergeant until 1672, as ensign until 1676, and as Lieutenant thereafter, by which title he is mainly reported, he rendreed good service, and often in command of scouting parties, even until past 2. the military age.

It is surmised that he may be the son of Thomas and Alice Leppingwell early spelling of the name-of White Colne, Essex, who was baptized in March 1624. There is also a family tradition that states he emigrated to America at the age of 14, going back to his native country at age 21 to marry Mary White and bring her here. It is noted in the book "THE LEFFINGWELL RECORD" a genealogy of the descendants of Lieutenant Thomas Leffingwell, that Thomas, son of Thomas and Alice Leppingwell, was baptized March 10, 1624. This may have been our ancestor.

That he was a thorough and enterprising business man appears in the worldly success which attended him and in the various offices to which he was called. No inventory of his estate has been found; but the land records of Norwich show that he ranked high among the real estate owners of his day.

The date of his death is not recorded but it is believed it occurred in the closing months of 1714, at which time he was probably 92 years of age. His wife, Mary Leffingwell, died February 6, 1711, probably at a very advanced age.

Lieutenant Thomas Leffingwell served in George Washington's Army and was commissioned by Queen Anne of England to help settle complaints of the Mohegan Indians and the Governor of the Colony of Connecticut.
